Register online between January 12 and March 3 – No Testing Fee to Pay*!

You will be charged if:

- You request to take an exam after the HHS order has been placed (\$93 per exam plus the \$55 late order fee)
- You cancel an exam after March 20 (\$25 unused exam fee per exam)
- You are not enrolled in the course this year (\$93 per exam)

Heritage High School Students

1. Go to www.TotalRegistration.net/AP/344118 and complete all required information.
2. Your same account exists from last year. Do not create a new account. Use password recovery if needed. Use your WCPSS email only.
3. Print the confirmation page and keep for your records.
4. Check the posted lists at Counseling Corner between March 6 - 10 to confirm your exams.

Homeschooled Student Instructions

Homeschooled students who currently reside at an address assigned to Heritage High School may register and take AP exams at Heritage High. Homeschooled students must sign in as a visitor at the main office. Note: all school/Collegeboard rules apply and homeschooled students may be subject to dismissal from an exam for not following AP exam rules/procedures.

1. You must register for exams in Student Services (before 12:30pm daily).
2. Write a check/money order payable to Heritage High School for the appropriate amount (\$93 per exam).
3. When making your payment, you must provide proof of residence (current utility bill) to verify Heritage High as your base school. In order to register, your base school must be Heritage High School.

Additional Information

All regular testing exam fees are paid through grant funding for all Heritage High School students for 2016-17. Students must still register online through total registration to officially register for an AP exam. Being enrolled in the course does not mean a student is registered to take the exam.

Exam locations will be shared once confirmed. See the AP Bulletin for specific dates. All morning exams begin at 7:25am and all afternoon exams begin at 11:30am.

Fee Waiver Information and Eligibility

Collegeboard provides a partial fee waiver to help offset the cost of AP exams for eligible students. Your 2017 exam costs are covered either through grant funding or grant funding plus fee waiver. How to determine if you're eligible for a fee waiver:

Fee reduction/waiver eligibility for Collegeboard AP exams is similar to the SAT fee waivers. Here are the following circumstances under which a student is deemed eligible for a fee reduction/waiver:

- The student is currently enrolled in a free or reduce-price lunch program at school.
- The student is enrolled in a program for the economically disadvantaged (for example, AVID or a TRIO program such as Upward Bound).
- The annual income of the student's family falls within with levels listed in the chart on page two of the SAT eligibility brochure, listed below:

Number of Members	Total Annual in Household Income
1	\$21,775
2	\$29,471
3	\$37,167
4	\$44,863
5	\$52,559
6	\$60,255

Note: For families with more than eight members, add \$7,696 for each additional family member.

- The student's family receives public assistance.
- The student's family lives in federally subsidized public housing.
- Student is a resident in a foster home.

Be sure to respond appropriately to the registration question regarding eligibility for Collegeboard fee waivers. This is critical for accounting purposes of exam payment and funding.
