Tips for Successful Course Registration

1. Take course selections seriously. Review all that is available to you. Your alternate course selections should be as important as the first eight courses you choose.
2. Participate in elective fairs and the College Fair on March 14.
3. Rising senior? Senior year is still important. Your choice of courses should reflect how you are maintaining/increasing rigor, exploring career options choosing unique options such as early graduation, dual enrollment, internship and more.
4. Do your research! Be prepared for college, NCAA and other post-secondary options by finding out what courses and or specific levels you should have while in high school.
5. Revisit your graduation plan and learn what courses you need to take and when.
6. Meet all registration deadlines. Mark dates in your student agenda.
7. Schedule an appointment to meet with your counselor individually.
8. Discuss your course selections with your parents/guardians.
